## Peripheral Artery Disease/PAD

PAD is a type of cardiovascular disease in which plaque builds up in the leg arteries leading to poor leg circulation and difficulty walking. It is an highly under-diagnosed and treated vascular condition. It is a marker of underlying coronary or carotid artery disease raising the risk of heart attack and stroke.

#### **Risk Factors for PAD:**

- Diabetes
- Smoking
- · High cholesterol
- High blood pressure
- · Arterial disease in other arteries
- · Heart disease or stroke in the past
- Kidney disease

# Symptoms of PAD:

- · Calf/hip/buttocks/foot pain with activity, foot pain at rest
- · Difficulty walking
- Non-healing leg wounds or gangrene
- Numbness/cramping/ decreased temperature in lower leg/foot

## Tests to Diagnose PAD:

#### · Ankle-brachial index (ABI). using BP cuffs on arms and legs

- Angiography
- CTA/Duplex imaging

### Treatment of PAD:

- · Exercise, lifestyle changes and medications
- · Catheter procedure with Balloon Angioplasty/Stent/Atherectomy
- Vascular Surgery





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
